There was a response to the vacancy for the CSB member representing hydropower from TVA. The CSB believes that TVA in name of Gabe Miller would be a good fit for the job. Status update Release 20.01 / Roadmaps 2020-2025

Gerben presents the status of the 20.01 release and the activities planned for the Roadmap 2020.

In relation to the release, it is discussed if the COVID-19 situation could affect the release planning.

It is expected that the release probably will not be affected, because Deltares and the Delft-FEWS development team are used to work remotely. Due to the measures taken to avoid infection, we also expect that the development team will not get sick all at the same moment. In case of illness, our team is robust enough to have back-ups. In case the planning doesn't meet the expected deadline, the impact will be limited due to the fact that there are no roll-outs planned before 1 July 2020,

Some activities are scheduled for 2020, however, the developments are part of proposals that are not yet granted. The question raises what should be done when proposals keep the status "in proposals". The CSB advises to communicate the proposed activities (that are on hold) to the community to open up funding opportunities for developments from the community. In addition, the CSB-members give the advice to describe the benefits of the specific feature(s) to stimulate discussion and crowdfunding / reach-out to community and potential contributors.

Standardisation Support & Maintenance and financing the roadmaps

Marcel presents the ideas from Delft-FEWS PM in relation to standardization of the Support and Maintenance contracts, including financing the Delft-FEWS 2025 activities.

The following comments/advices are given:

- Timeline: make a clear distinction between new and existing clients
- Why 3-4 different levels, what are the details, what do you get? → It hasn't been decided yet
 how many levels. This are just first thoughts. From the current analysis, it seems that most of
 the clients will fit in the highest class. We expect less critical systems to fit in intermediate levels.
 Standalone applications, consultants will probably fit in the lowest level. We agree that the levels
 need to be detailed more.
- Take note of the fact that a new contract will be seen as a way to hide/increase costs.
- Question: Would you differ between the WIS (Water Information Systems) and forecasting systems (Decision Support Systems, DSS)? How are you going to way the service levels with respect to these different types of users? → Marcel: we prefer that there is no difference between the different types of users. They should all fit in the service levels. →In that case it is good to emphasize in describing the service levels how the WIS-users will benefit from the services. Marcel: We will discuss this in the GO-FEWS user group. We can clarify and discuss different types of contracts. This will be part of the process of developing the S&M levels.
- Some systems are not critical during 95% of the time, but when you are in a critical situation, you would like to scale up to a different service level. Would it be possible to take that into account? Marcel: I take note of that. Maybe as an additional element to the list of elements.
- Take into account what's involved in for example not taking the release every year. This differs
 per year for some clients.
- · It is expected that standardization also fits within Times & Materials contract.
- · Financing parts of the back-end developments as part of the S&M is the most equal approach.
- In relation to accountability it will be important to give clarity from the start: what will be delivered during that year of S&M (roadmap features). Something needs to be provided to support the spending of money.

Feedback from the community

Netherlands - some waterboards experienced performance issues in relation to the amalgamate module (the amalgamate module packs and optimizes the data internally in the database) Today, there was a conference call with Deltares. Specific systems need a specific decision-tree how to configure the amalgamate for the different systems. Deltares provides insights/instructions. For upcoming releases Deltares aims at simplifying this amalgamate module by making it more automatic and removing configuration options to avoid errors.
